


Whether it's the headwater

Watershed.


History

- 1997 - Monitoring efforts of water quality through Alabama Water Watch
- 1998 - Wolf Bay Watershed Watch was formed with the mission to promote the conservation, protection and improvement of the natural resources within the Wolf Bay Watershed through monitoring and educational programs.
- 2001 - Wolf Bay Watershed requested ADEM to upgrade portions of the watershed as an Outstanding Alabama Water (OAW)
- 2005 - "Wolf Bay Plan: A Stakeholder's Guide to Protecting the Watershed"
- April 20, 2007 - Wolf Bay and several of its tributaries received OAW status
- Onward – the Watershed Watch grew up to 300 members. These efforts set a foundation to establish the Wolf Bay Watershed as a leader among grassroots organizations in Alabama.


