RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE DOG RIVER COMPREHENSIVE WATERSHED MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan for the Dog River Watershed, located within the city of Mobile and unincorporated areas of Mobile County, Alabama, was prepared by the Mobile Bay National Estuary Program and other concerned community leaders with interest in the long-term viability of this area. In agreement with the spirit and goals of this plan, and acknowledging the environmental and economic importance and value of this watershed, a call for intergovernmental cooperation is necessary to successfully achieve this restoration and conservation program.

Whereas, the Dog River Watershed, draining southern portions of the City of Mobile and adjacent, unincorporated areas of Mobile County, Alabama, encompasses 59,705 acres and contributes to the health and vitality of its receiving waters of Mobile Bay, and

Whereas, the landscape of this watershed ranges from gently rolling terrain in headwaters downstream to low coastal plains, tidal marshes, and historic wooded wetlands, and

Whereas, the landscape of the upper watershed has undergone extensive commercial and residential development resulting in 22% impervious cover while the lower watershed contains tracts of unspoiled hardwood bottomlands, freshwater wetlands, and coastal marshes, with less than 12% impervious cover, and

Whereas, conversion of the natural landscape to impervious cover has caused increases in volume and velocity of stormwater runoff in this watershed, resulting in increased flooding; non-point source pollution impacts that include trash and litter, pathogens, and nutrients; channel erosion; degraded habitats and infrastructure; and deteriorated water quality in its tributaries and creeks that ultimately transport non-point source pollution and sediment into Mobile Bay, and

Whereas, one tributary in this Watershed – Halls Mill Creek– is listed on the 2017 Alabama 303(d) list for impairment by siltation, and

Whereas, Total Maximum Daily Loads for pathogens and organic enrichment/low dissolved oxygen have been approved by U.S. EPA for Bolton Branch, Eslava Creek, Rabbit Creek, and Upper Dog River, and

Whereas, a Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan for the Dog River Watershed, funded by the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation Gulf Environmental Benefit Fund and completed in October 2017, documented the current state of the water quality and ecological impairment in the Watershed; described major pollutants; assessed future climate change

scenarios; evaluated potential improvement measures and practices; and recommended a prioritized list of watershed improvement actions,

Whereas, the natural resources goals stated in the *Map for Mobile* include "protection of watersheds and sensitive habitat areas", and the *Future Land Use Plan* for the City has identified Priority Investment Opportunity Areas within the Watershed including the Dauphin Island Parkway corridor, Michigan Avenue corridor, Airport Boulevard and I-65 intersection, the Government Street corridor, the Loop, and Tillman's Corner,

Now, therefore be it resolved by the legislative body of the City of Mobile, Alabama that it endorses the *Comprehensive Watershed Management Plan for the Dog River Watershed*, and

Be it further resolved that the City of Mobile, willingly and in full support, agrees to partner with the Dog River Clearwater Revival and the Mobile Bay National Estuary Program to focus on implementation of specific measures and actions contained in the watershed management plan that coincide with goals stated in the *Map for Mobile*.
