


It was a pleasure speaking with you last week. We are working to address the stormwater issues in the drainage area on the north side of Wal-Mart. We appreciate your continued cooperation in handling maintenance issues regarding stormwater management facilities.

The City of Foley would also like to commend Wal-Mart and their staff for the continued effort to reduce litter and pollution from entering the headwaters of the Bon Secour River. Wal-Mart's initiative to install trash receptacles through the parking area and the daily parking lot cleaning demonstrates your efforts to create a clean water future. The City would like to continue to work with Wal-Mart in these efforts as we plan community clean up days to fight litter. 
